WELCOME AND INTRODUCTIONS:

The Chair, Chris, called the meeting to order at 7:02 p.m. and a quorum was established. Attendees were asked to sign in to assert membership.

Chris introduced Adam Lyons, Executive Director of the Northeast Coalition of Neighborhoods (NECN) as the election monitor in charge of CNA's 2019 Board election. Chris announced that elections would commence at 8 p.m., immediately after the guest speaker, Ms. Hardesty.

Chris also introduced Steve Elder, Board Member to formally introduce and welcome Portland City Commissioner, Jo Ann Hardesty as the guest.

GUEST SPEAKER:

Member Steve Elder introduced Portland City Commissioner Jo Ann Hardesty. Ms. Hardesty provided an overview of the bureaus she oversees, which include: Portland Fire & Rescue, Portland Bureau of Emergency Management, Bureau of Emergency Communications, and the Fire & Police Disability and Retirement Fund. She indicated that one of her goals is to ensure that when someone calls 911, that the operators are trained to ask a series of questions in order to send the proper response team to the requestor (i.e., if the situation calls for a mental health response, a mental health person is dispatched instead of a police officer). Ms. Hardesty opened the floor to attendees to ask questions and offer suggestions. In closing, Ms. Hardesty said that there were three major items that community members

could do: (1) participate in the City's budget formation; (2) support her in her effort with street responses, and (3) show up at the Portland City Hall meetings on a regular basis.

NOMINATION AND ELECTION OF BOARD MEMBERS:

Chris announced that due to a lack of quorum during the November 2018 meeting, elections could not be held and temporary members were in place. The candidate positions would need to be ratified at this meeting and elections held. Chris then introduced Adam Lyons from NECN as the election monitor. Quorum was re-established (more than 15 members who are not current Board Members).

The positions open for election were reviewed, nothing that all were for two-year terms except for the Chair, which is a one-year term. Mr. Lyons explained how nominations would be called and seconds would be required at least three times for each position, followed by a brief statement (if any) by each candidate, and then voting would begin. If more than one person was nominated for a position, then a secret ballot would be used. For uncontested positions, a show of hands to indicate a majority support would be used.
